To all Sangamon County Historical Society members and friends - welcome back for our 1991 - 1992 season! Our fall program begins with a meeting at the State Capitol on Sept. 25, followed by the fall tour on Sept. 28 and the Sixth Lincoln Colloquium on Oct. 26.

SEPTEMBER PROGRAM - AN INTIMATE LOOK AT THE ILLINOIS STATE CAPITOL

Join us at the Illinois State Capitol on Wednesday, September 25, for a special evening devoted to the history and architecture of our magnificent Capitol. Mark Sorensen, Assistant Director of the Illinois State Archives, will deliver an illustrated talk and then conduct a short tour. Guests will learn about the building's 100-year history, see an exhibit that Mark developed, and get a closeup look at such marvels as the famous "lost room," the House and Senate ceilings, the rotunda, and the dome.

Mark Sorensen lives in Decatur and formerly taught high school history there. In recent years at the State Archives he has conducted research and produced historical programs and exhibits for various state facilities, including the Stratton Building, the Centennial Building, the State Library, and others. He has served on the boards of the Macon County Historical Society and the Decatur Public Library.

You may park in any of the state lots around the Capitol, but the most convenient would be the curved driveway and lot at the north end of the statehouse grounds. You must use the north entrance to the building, where you can sign in and receive directions to Room 212.

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ITINERARY FOR THE FALL TOUR - SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 1991

- 7:30 Leave Springfield from the southwest corner of the Stratton Building
Parking Lot near the intersection of College and Edwards Streets.
- 9:30 Arrive at Galesburg. First, we visit the Carl Sandburg Home. Here
we shall watch a film, look at displays, and have a tour of the house
and its furnishings.
- 10:30 We visit the railroad museum, a few blocks from the Sandburg Home, a
display of trains and other railroad artifacts at several locations.
- 11:30 - 1:00 Jumer's restaurant. We will order from the menu for our big meal of
the day. The food is delicious. The tour group that ate there for
our Bishop Hill tour was impressed.
- 1:00 We tour Knox College, a very old institution like Jubilee College.
Yet, it is still in operation. One of the important sites is "Old
Main", the oldest structure on campus and one of the most ancient
"old mains" in the region.
- 2:15 The group travels to Knoxville. We tour the Old Knox County Court-
house, its grounds, and some adjoining museums, one of which is run
by the Knox County Historical Society.
- 3:15 - 4:00 Enroute to Jubilee College State Park near Peoria.
- 4:00 - 5:00 We tour Jubilee College in a state park of that name. This college
was founded by an Episcopal bishop. A number of years ago, we had
a program on Jubilee College. Now we can see what the program was
about.
- 5:00 - 5:30 Enroute to Hardee's on the north side of Peoria just off the highway.
- 5:30 - 6:30 We have supper at Hardee's. (Our schedule is flexible, since we will
leave as soon as everyone is done.)
- 6:30 Leave Peoria.
- 8:00 Arrive back in Springfield.

The cost of the tour is \$20 for members and \$25 for non-members. This price in-
cludes all gratuities and admission fees. This tour includes many interesting
sites: two colleges, two important state historical sites, two restaurants with
tasty food, a railroad museum, and a museum of a sister historical society.
September's early autumn will provide a comfortable tour. Please mark your
calendars and sign up for this educational and entertaining trip.
