over a number of years the land was sold. In 1931 the remaining building and grounds were given to the State of Illinois by the owner at that time, Dr. George A. Zeller. In 1971 a Citizens Committee to Preserve Jubilee College was organized to help and encourage the state to restore the property, which is now a State Historic Site. It is managed by the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, and the restored chapel, a schoolroom and dormitory, the library and Samuel Chase's study are open to visitors. The dormitory is furnished with antiques donated by the Citizens Committee. The chapel is still in use. While our members were viewing the interior, a wedding party gathered outside, entering for their ceremony as soon as the SCHS tour ended!

Following the tour of Jubilee College our group stopped for supper at Hardees in Peoria before coming back to Springfield, ending a very pleasant fall tour. Our thanks to Fred and Evelyn Adams for their information on the trip. They have noted that some of the outstanding features of the trip were the cordial greeting and expert guide service given by members of local historical groups at each stop.
