Officers

For President, Stephanie Martin

Martin, a librarian in the Sangamon Valley Collection at the City of Springfield's Lincoln Library, earned her bachelor's degree in American Studies from Knox College in Galesburg, a master's in Historical Administration from Eastern Illinois University and a master's in Library and Information Science from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. She is a past president of the Springfield Jaycees.



For Vice President, Susan Helm

Helm is retired from the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine where she served as Director of Marketing for Surgery. She joined the Society in 2016 and has served on the Publicity and Marketing and Cemetery Walk committees. She is a University of Illinois Extension Master Gardener and Master Naturalist volunteer, specializing in establishing pollinator habitats. She has served on many community boards but currently sits on this one and the Denim & Diamonds board. She recently received the Springfield Business Journal's Women of Influence Award 2021.



For Secretary, Elaine Hoff

Born, raised and receiving her education in Michigan, Elaine Hoff taught special education in Michigan and northern Illinois before moving to Springfield in 1967. For most of her professional life she worked in the field of disability rights, most recently as policy advisor for the Illinois Attorney General, retiring in 2003. Hoff has been affiliated with a number of disability rights organizations, founding a local group addressing needs of "kids at risk" and an organization that advocated for gifted children's programs. She was first elected to the board for a three-year term in 2011 and has chaired the Society's Special Projects Committee 2014-2020.



For Treasurer, Jerry Smith

Smith, who is a Springfield native, is seeking his sixth term as Treasurer. He earned an associate's degree from Springfield College in Illinois and pursued studies in business administration at Southern Illinois University. For most of 35 years, he traveled the United States opening and managing various hotels in Florida, Colorado, Ohio, Indiana, North Carolina, Montana, Maryland, Alabama, and finally back to Springfield to retire. After returning "home" in 2006, he managed the conversion of the Springfield Renaissance Hotel to the President Abraham Lincoln Hotel for three years. He volunteers at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum and Pleasant Plains Historical Society's historic site, Clayville.

Mary Alice Davis

Davis has a Bachelor of Arts degree from Denison University, Granville, Ohio, taught for 4 years, co-owned a children's clothing store for 10 years, and co-owned a chain of fast food stores for 35 years. She is past president of the Society (2014-2016), its Secretary (2012-2013), and co-chaired the Program Committee (2012-2019). Davis has chaired the Society's annual Cemetery Walk since 2015 to the present. She is a Westminster Presbyterian elder, past chairman and trustee of the Illinois State Museum Society Board, past vice-president of the Old State Capitol Foundation and served as a docent and past vice-president of the Land of Lincoln, Girl Scout Council.



Kathy Hoffmann

A retired mathematics teacher, Hoffmann spent the majority of her career at Springfield High School, retiring in 2001 as department chair. She holds degrees in mathematics from Nebraska Wesleyan University and Sangamon State University. She served on the Board (2011- 2014) and was appointed to fill a vacancy in 2017. She has served on several community boards including Lincoln Memorial Garden, The Hoogland Center for the Arts, and Goodwill Industries. Hoffmann is also a past chair of the Docent Program at the First Presbyterian Church. She is a World Affairs Council of Central Illinois board member and serves as secretary.



Cinda Klickna

Cinda Klickna taught English in District 186 for 25 years and served in various leadership roles with the Illinois Education Association/NEA for 18 years. She has been a freelance writer since she wrote her first article for Illinois Times in the 1980s. She is on the board of the Dana Thomas House Foundation and the Illinois State Museum Society.



Doug Polite

A semi-retired real estate broker who owns and operates the historic Flagg Farmstead Bed and Breakfast in Sherman, Polite graduated from Knox College in Galesburg, Illinois in 1964 with a degree in business administration and economics and received a masters degree from the University of Tennessee in 1969 in transportation economics and statistics. He served on the historic committee for the 150th anniversary of the Village of Sherman. Polite is co-chair of the Society's Finance Committee.






