# The Marbold Farmstead - A Legacy in the Making April 15 5:30 pm @ Lincoln Library



Just a quick glance at the before and after pictures of the Marbold Homestead shows the amazing restoration that the engaged Historic Marbold Farmstead Association has accomplished.

President of the Association, Barbara Van Dyke-Brown will share how the group tackled restoring a run-down, rat and termite infested, sagging house that had been overgrown with weeds and stripped by looters.

The Marbold Farmstead was established with the purchase of the property by John H. Marbold in 1851. John, an immigrant from Badbergen, Germany was an

experienced farmer and livestock breeder. He traveled to Menard County at the recommendation of his brother to relocate his family. A widower, John was the father of 3 children, who arrived with him. He established a homestead on the current site that would carry on



for 3 generations. Located just off Route 29, the Marbold home remains a landmark in the community.

In 2004, community members and other interested parties came

With the property purchased in 2012, the Association is dedicated to creating a living history farm, focused on the agricultural history of the area from 1880 - 1910. The Association has worked diligently providing educational opportunities for young and old to learn more about the historical and agricultural significance of the Marbold Farmstead during this period.

### **Grant Funds Available for Historic Projects**



The Sangamon County Historical Society is now taking applications for funding historic special projects within the county that carry out its mission, which is to preserve and promote interest in the history of Sangamon County.

Last year the Society gave grants to the following: Prairie Skies Public Library District for the digitization of microfilm for three Pleasant Plains surrounding newspapers, Pleasant Plains Press, The Review & The Argus; Oak Ridge Cemetery Foundation for six Springfield Underground Railroad Conductor Grave Markers; Thomas Rees Memorial Carillon, The Belles Group (Rees Carillon Society) to help produce an educational video to be used in the classroom for K-6th grade students to tie in with the Illinois State Music Learning Standards.



Several conductors buried at Farmington (Farmingdale) Cemetery less than a mile away will be remembered. Tazewell County Clerk John C. Ackerman will once again represent the previous statewide commission's final report and share the status of the work moving forward. Following the ceremony, interested audience members will travel to the cemetery to place the specifically created markers on the conductors' graves. Light refreshments will be offered. #### **Member Info Hub**

Members can log in to the Info Hub to:

- Update contact information
- View and register for events
- View and pay invoices
- View and upload resources

### To log in to the Info Hub

- From the Home Page, click Member Login
- If you have not set up your account, under "Don't have an account", click "Create One"
- Enter first name, last name and email address
- If a match is found in the database (we must have your email on file), you will receive an email to create a login. Within this email there will be a link to create your username and password. Admins will NOT have access to your password.
- If no email match is found, you will receive notice that the account cannot be created. Please provide an email addess to be able to proceed.





If you want to access the Info Hub from your cell phone, download the Member Plus App.

With the app you can easily stay up to date with events, news and other information, update your contact information, pay open invoices and access resources. The app also offers push notification. For example, in the event that a program is cancelled due to weather, you would receive a direct notice on your cell phone.



The app is available in iTunes and Google Playstore.

Please log in to the Member Info Hub and make sure your information is correct so you don't miss out on anything!

While registration is not required for the monthly programs, if you do register in advance you will receive a confirmation with event details, AND you will get a reminder email.
